



Economic impact summary of GJFO proposal- GJFO horribly undervalues economic contributions of recreation

1. a. GJFO Plan asserts total recreational value is:

"Recreation would generate nearly **§7.2 million in total spending,** \$4.4 million in total value added and **90 full-time equivalent jobs** by 2029." ¹

1b. GJFO closures would impact economics as follows:

"Economic effects from recreation would be similar but <u>slightly less</u> than Alternative A. Motorized use is anticipated to be slightly less under this alternative, while mechanized and non-mechanized use may increase."

2. COHVCO found significant motorized recreational economic contributions for NW & SW Colorado including Garfield and Mesa County

Motorized recreation provides over 141 million in spending to the GJFO planning area and 214 jobs directly related to motorized rec. every year as follows:


3. CPW economic impact to Garfield & Mesa counties from hunting

In 2007 CPW performed an Economic Contribution Analysis for hunting and fishing expenditures. The Organizations must note that the expenditures for recreation calculated in the draft RMP are wholly irreconcilable with these calculations as well.
