





Current Motorized Trail Mileage in CO (Current MVUM's)

- Trails Open to All ~ 146 miles (~93 miles yearlong; ~53 miles seasonal)
- 50" or less ~ 1,440 miles (~1,052 miles yearlong; ~ 388 miles seasonal)
- Motorcycle Only ~ 1,304 miles (~1,008 miles yearlong; ~ 296 miles seasonal)
- Special Designation ~ 423 miles (~249 miles yearlong;
 174 miles seasonal)
- Total Trail Miles Open to Motorized Use ~
 3,313 miles
- Roads Open to All Vehicles ~ 11,152 mile (~5,842 yearlong; 5,310 seasonal)






Rocky Mountain Region Trails Budget








